

## **2026—2030 National Coaching Certification Program Redistribution Model**

Every four years, Federal – Provincial / Territorial governments review and confirm the official mandate of the Coaching Association of Canada (CAC). The procedure used to determine the financial model to ensure continued investment by the partnership in the mandate into the National Coaching Certification Program (NCCP) is one of the elements that are reviewed and confirmed at the end of every four-year cycle. The 2022—2026 Partner reinvestment fee model has been in effect since 2014.

In 2023, the Sport Physical Activity and Recreation Council (SPARC) endorsed and directed the CAC to conduct a review of the NCCP financial model across the partnership. Over the last three years, through Partners Congress, town halls, surveys and interviews, the CAC conducted a consultation with National Sport Organizations (NSO), Provincial / Territorial Coaching Representatives (P/TCR) and federal – provincial / territorial (F-P/T) governments on the 2026—2030 NCCP model for the development and delivery of the NCCP. The CAC also engaged a consulting firm to analyse and audit the data, along with NCCP partner business models as part of the final recommendation to the partners for endorsement.

## **2026—2030 Redistribution Model currently based on the NCCP multisport module Make Ethical Decisions (MED) eLearning Revenue**

In October 2025, Sport Physical Activity and Recreation Council (SPARC) approved a new National Coaching Certification Program (NCCP) **Redistribution Model**, with the following recommendations, to be implemented as of April 1, 2026 to April 1, 2030.

1. That the previous NCCP Reinvestment Fee Model sunset by March 31, 2026;
2. That as of April 1, 2026, the transition to a “Make Ethical Decisions” (MED) eLearning model for all partners (PT/PTCR/CAC/NSOs and PTSOs) be implemented; and
3. That the revenue generation consists of a fair redistribution of MED eLearning based on a cost of \$80.00 per participant (and processing fee):
  - a. 60% PTCR (based on address of the coach in the Locker)
  - b. 40% to CAC of which:
    - i. 31% remains with the CAC; and,
    - ii. 9% is redistributed to NSOs (See Appendix B and C)

4. The CAC also commits to the ongoing **Support to Sport Program** of \$375,000 per year to NSOs included in the mandate (as outlined in [Appendix B](#)) for NCCP development.

The \$375,000 **Support to Sport Program** will provide to each of the NSOs currently in the mandated NCCP partnership (please see [Appendix B](#)) an equal base amount of \$5,859. This distribution of funding is based on CAC approved NSO NCCP project plans built upon system priorities for each year, and in alignment with the current mandate agreement.

NSOs have the option to redirect all or a portion of their **fixed base amount** to creative solutions, facilitated by the CAC. Each year, based on demand, a transparent and shared-expense model by opt-in NSOs will be created and managed by the CAC.

The investment back into the partnership of the **Redistribution Model** through the Make Ethical Decisions eLearning revenue ensures sustainability in the development and delivery of the NCCP across Canada's coaching ecosystem.

#### **NCCP Make Ethical Decisions eLearning Module Cost per participant:**

Total gross cost charged for MED eLearning module: \$85.00 CAD

#### **Fee Breakdown:**

- Stripe Transaction Fee: \$2.77 CAD (2.9% + \$0.30 per transaction)
- Hosting & Administration Fee: \$2.23 CAD
- Net Remittance Amount to be redistributed: \$80.00 CAD

#### **Reporting:**

CAC commits to providing consistent updates and reports to the NCCP partnership on the Redistribution Model based on NCCP multisport module Make Ethical Decisions eLearning Revenue as follows:

- i. An annual report following the end of each fiscal.
- ii. Quarterly reports as part of the remittance process
